Mission

IVC provides meaningful volunteer opportunities for individuals age fifty and above to serve the needs of people who are poor, to work for a more just society, and to grow deeper in their Christian faith by reflecting and praying in the Ignatian tradition.

Vision

Operating within the program's annual \$100,000 budget, IVC NEPA will increase the number of mission-driven volunteers and partner agencies serving the materially poor by August 31, 2020.

Goal 1:

To grow and nurture IVC's volunteers who share their professional and life skills with individuals & families experiencing material poverty

Goal 2:

To strategically expand partner agencies capacity to serve individuals & families experiencing material poverty

Strategy 1: Meaningful Volunteer Experience

- Volunteer Surveys;
- Strong Community; and
- Impactful reflection program

Strategy 2: Increase Ignatian Volunteers

- Educational Institutions;
- Parishes; and
- Strategic Relationships

Strategy: Enhance Partner Agency Capacity

- Assess partner agency needs;
- Measure how IVC fulfills these needs; and
- Partner agency retention

Strategy: Increase Partner Agencies

- Partner agency video;
- Current partner agencies recruit new partner agencies; and
- Monthly prospective partner agency meetings.

Impact Outcomes

Each year:

- 90% volunteer retention, exclusive of health issues; and
- 90% of volunteers conclude IVC is a meaningful volunteer experience
