## **Campaign Goals**

IVC members in service have increased 85% over the past five years and continue to expand. In order to meet the growing demand for Ignatian Volunteers and to take advantage of the increased numbers of men and women seeking to make their retirement years full with meaningful experiences and service, IVC seeks to raise \$3 million in additional funding to expand operational capacity and to support the launch of an important new partnership initiative:

- Sustain the trajectory of growth of the volunteer corps in the next three years to 1,000 part-time staff level volunteers, expandin g services in four existing regions and launching five new regions.
- Launch and Fund the new Jesuit College/ University Partnership Initiative, established to recruit alumni of these schools to serve as IVC volunteers, sustain the expansion of service regions and provide opportunities for joint programming.
- Build operational capacity in key areas including advancement, technology, human resources, marketing and communications as well as an operating reserve fund to manage revenue streams and long-term planning.

#### Impact

Annually, the Ignatian Volunteer Corps has a national impact on poverty:

- 600+ IVC men and women placed and supported;
- Annual hours of professional 325,000+ level services across more than 20 metropolitan areas;
  - 450+ local non-profit agencies served:

#### Commitment

Their work, commitment and dedication, often sustained for years, greatly enhance the capacity of organizations to serve more people despite limited resources.


### Spirituality
